- **Q&A & Moderator**
- As host of the Son Rise Morning Show on Cincinnati's Sacred Heart Catholic Radio, Brian Patrick shares weekday mornings with Greater Cincinnati's Catholic Christians in prayer, reflection, and thoughtful discussion about our journey of faith and Church traditions. - Brian is the founder of GNN, The Good News Network, a not-for-profit media ministry spreading the Word of God through the electronic media of television, radio and the internet.



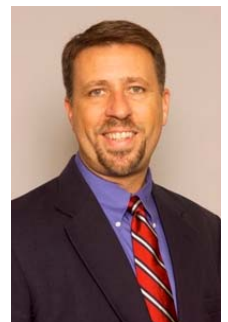
### DANNY ABRAMOWICZ

- **Topic: Transformation**
- Danny Abramowicz is presently involved in full-time work with Crossing the Goal ministries which is an evangelization outreach to Catholic men nationally. Crossing the Goal ministry utilizes TV, internet technology, conferences, and leadership training seminars to accomplish its goal. Mr. Abramowicz also had a long history with the NFL as a player, coach and broadcaster.
- Danny was born July 13, 1945, in Steubenville, Ohio. He attended Xavier University in Cincinnati, Ohio and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in 1967. Xavier University has presented Danny with the two most prestigious awards bestowed on a student athlete - Legion of Honor and Hall of Fame. In 1967, Danny was drafted in the 17th and last round by the New Orleans Saints. Danny's NFL career spanned eight seasons. Some of his accomplishments include the NFL's leading receiver and All-Pro in 1969. Danny was voted to the Saints Silver Anniversary Team. Danny is a member of the following Halls of Fame: Louisiana, Saints, Sugar Bowl, Sports Faith, and National Polish.
- Currently, Danny is active serving on the Board of Directors of EWTN, Crossing the Goal and the Donum Dei Foundation. Also, he serves in an advisory capacity to the Board of Directors of National Fellowship of Catholic Men. Danny serves as a co-chair for Franciscan University of Steubenville Capital Drive for Athletics. Danny travels throughout the United States speaking at Catholic men's conferences.
- Danny and his wife, Claudia, have been married for 42 years and have three children and four grandsons.

- FOCUS was founded in 1998 as a national outreach to college campuses, both to secular and Catholic schools. Through small group Bible studies, large group leadership training, and one-on-one discipleship, FOCUS brings the fullness of life and truth in the Catholic Church to college students, and equips them with the tools to help them share this good news with their friends. FOCUS is working to play a vital role in the "New Evangelization" called for by Pope John Paul II.
- In 2008-2009, FOCUS missionaries serve on 39 campuses in 21 states, with plans to reach 100 campuses in the next ten years.
- Whether he is on college campuses or television, at conferences or working with corporate America, Curtis is an award-winning and proven dynamic speaker who has the ability to help his audience discover a vision for life.

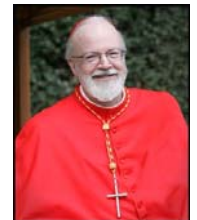
## FATHER PAUL O'BRIEN

#### 4. Theme and Keynote Address Topics from EWTN's Crossing the Goal Team

- **Crossing The Goal Ministry Mission Statement:** To challenge and activate men to a life of conversion, transformation, and mission (evangelization.)
  1. **Conversion:**
    - "The proclamation of the Word of God has Christian conversion as its aim: a complete and sincere adherence to Christ and his Gospel through faith. Conversion is a gift of God, a work of the Blessed Trinity." (Redemptoris Missio #46)
    - "From the outset, conversion is expressed in faith which is total and radical...Conversion means accepting, by a personal decision, the saving sovereignty of Christ and becoming his disciple." (RM #46)
    - "The Church in America is called to proclaim with renewed vigor that conversion consists in commitment to the person of Jesus Christ." (Ecclesia in America #53)
  2. **Transformation:**
    - "To follow Jesus involves living as he lived, accepting his message, adopting his way of thinking, embracing his destiny and sharing his project, which is the plan of the Father: it involves inviting everyone to communion with the Trinity and to communion among ourselves in a just and fraternal society." (EA #68)
    - "...it is more necessary than ever for all the faithful to move from a faith of habit, sustained perhaps by social context alone, to a faith which is conscious and personally lived." (EA #73)
  3. **Mission (Evangelization)**
    - "We wish to confirm once more that the task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church...evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize..." (Evangelii Nuntiandi #14)
    - The whole Church is missionary, and the work of evangelization is a basic duty of the People of God." (Quoting Vat II Ad Gentes #35)
    - "To be true disciples of the Lord, believers must bear witness to their faith, and "witnesses testify not only with words, but also with their lives" (EA #26)
    - "Yet the lay faithful too, precisely as members of the Church, have the vocation and mission of proclaiming the Gospel: they are prepared for this work by the sacraments of Christian initiation and by the gifts of the Holy Spirit." (EA #66)
    - "Our own time, with humanity on the move and in continual search, demands a resurgence of the Church's missionary activity. The horizons and possibilities for mission are growing ever wider, and we Christians are called to an apostolic courage based upon trust in the Spirit. He is the principal agent of mission!" (RM #30)

#### 5. Adoration & Confession

- Adoration and Confession will be held in the lower level of the Cathedral. Attendees can exit the Church through the Union Park exit and go to the lower level. Please see the enclosed venue map/restroom map.

#### 6. Tickets

- Tickets are available at the door for \$20.
- All ticket orders received on 4/12 or after will be held for pickup at the door.
- Ticket questions/issues can be answered at the Conferences if you believe you've ordered tickets and they have yet to arrive.
- **Lunches must be pre-bought.** No lunches will be available for sale at the Conference due to advance ordering with the caterer.
- **Clergy, religious, seminarian tickets** are free and can be ordered separately at [www.CatholicBoston.com](http://www.CatholicBoston.com).
- **The earlier the ticket is purchased, the better the seat.** Tickets will be assigned to specific rows/seats in the Cathedral. If you have a group, we encourage you to order tickets together so you'll be in the same row/section.
- **Name badges will be required.** We will have tools to allow individuals/captains to pre-print name badges (otherwise people can handwrite a name card at the Conference).
- **All ticket sales are final** - there are no refunds for tickets. However, tickets can be given/transferred to another attendee. For lunch ticket refunds, please see above.
- **Discounted tickets are available on request.** We want everyone who is interested in attending the Conferences to come, regardless of their ability to pay. - We will have breakfast foods, coffee, tea and water for purchase in the Cathedral HS cafeteria from 8:00-10:30.

## 8. Lunch & Lunch Seating

- We will purchase boxed lunches for **everyone that pre-orders them**.
- If you don't pre-order lunch, we encourage you to bring your lunch. Additionally, there are some restaurants in the South End.
- There is a 200-seat cafeteria available for attendees to eat lunch. Like previous conferences, attendees are encouraged to eat their lunch anywhere throughout the venues.

## 9. Conference Check-in and Registration

- Check-in will be at the Main Entrance of the Cathedral at 1400 Washington Street.
- HCP check-in will be on Union Park Street lower level. Wheelchairs will be located there to use with the elevator.

## 10. Name Badges & Wristbands

## 11. Cathedral Seating Chart

- There are 1735 seats in the pews at the Cathedral.
  - This does not include portable seats added up front or seats in the choir loft.
  - This also assumes comfortable spacing in the pews.
  - Pews are wooden, so conference attendees want to bring/purchase seat cushions if they prefer.
  - Additional seating/standing will be available in the back.
- We expect a total attendance of about 1500-1700.
- All the seats are **reserved** this year. Attendees will be assigned a row and a seat number on their ticket. Within a row (pew), the seats are not numbered.
- The earlier someone purchases a ticket, the better the seat will be, so we encourage people to order early and buy enough tickets for their group to assure that the group can sit together.
- Attendees can trade seats to facilitate groups sitting together at their discretion.

## 12. Seat Cushions

- Seat cushions are available for purchase for \$6 for anyone concerned about sitting in a wooden pew for many hours.

### 13. Restrooms

- Restrooms will be in the various venues of the Conference.
  1. Cathedral HS Gym (exhibitors): There is a Men's Room with 5 units and a Women's room with 7 units.
  2. Cathedral HS Cafeteria (lunch): There is a Men's Room with 4 units and a Women's room with 3 units.
  3. Cathedral Lower Level: There are 4 individual restrooms: 2 in the back, 2 by the center for HCP.
- Please see "restroom/venue" map included.

### 14. Handicap Accessibility

- Yes. There is a handicap ramp along the Union Park Street side (left side) of the Cathedral that leads to the basement. In the basement there is a new elevator that will bring attendees to the main floor of the Cathedral.
- We encourage attendees to bring their own wheelchairs. We have a few Conference wheelchairs that can be used to transport attendees but since we only have a few, we will need them to transport others and they can't be reserved for the day.
- Handicap seating will be up the front of the Cathedral, on the Msgr. Reynolds Way side. Please see a conference volunteer for assistance.

- **FROM POINTS WEST:** Route 90 East (Mass Pike) to Exit 22 Stuart Street; Right onto Dartmouth Street; Continue to W. Dedham Street; Left onto Washington Street; The Cathedral is on your right
- **FROM POINTS SOUTH:** Route 93 North; Exit 18 Frontage Road towards Mass Avenue; Left on General Pulaski Skyway (2nd left); Right onto Massachusetts Avenue; Right onto Washington Street; The Cathedral is on your right
- **FROM POINTS NORTH:** Route 93 South; Exit 20A to Albany Street (same exit as Mass Pike); Stay left onto Albany Street; Right at E Berkley Street; Left on Washington Street; The Cathedral is on your left
- **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:** The Silver Line stops right in front of the Cathedral at 1400 Washington Street. This is the Silver Line's Union Park Street stop. For Silver Line connection information, please go to [www.CatholicBoston.com](http://www.CatholicBoston.com) and click on the directions website which will take you to the MBTA information.

### 16. Parking & Courtesy Shuttle

- Parking is at the Boston Medical Center garage at **710 Albany Street** (1,000 spots) for \$5. It is also available on the streets (meters).
- **There will be 2 courtesy shuttles from Albany Street to the Cathedral. The shuttle will run from 7:00-9:30 am and from 4:30-6:30pm.**
- This lot is an 8-minute walk from the Cathedral.

### 18. Priest Parking

- Priests can park in the lot across from Cathedral Grammar School (corner of Malden and Harrison). A priest parking pass is required. This will be mailed out to all registered priests about 10 days prior to the Conference.

### 19. Bus drop-off and pickup

- Buses can drop off attendees at 1400 Washington Street (the main entrance for the Cathedral)
- Pickup will be on Union Park Street.

### 20. Bus parking

- Any buses that will remain for the day can park on Biosquare drive, along the 610 Albany Street garage, per the permission of the Boston Medical Center parking manager, Lou D'Addario. They can then take the shuttle bus or walk to the Cathedral if they would like.
